

GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS



The Government Documents Collection has gone digital!

The last year has brought several changes to the <u>Federal Depository Library Program</u> in which MSUB Library participates. Microfilm has been phased out entirely and more and more backfiles are being digitized. This has led to the Library deciding to become a Digital Depository. That means all new government documents added to the collection are in electronic format only. All electronic government documents can be accessed through the <u>MSUB Library Catalog</u>. The current print collection of documents already housed in the Library will remain as it is.

LIBRARY INSTRUCTION

The MSU-Billings Library provides high-quality library instruction sessions for all levels of MSUB courses. A member of our Instruction Team will tailor a session to fit the specific needs of your course and your students. In order for library staff to adequately prepare an instruction session please make your instruction request a minimum of one week in advance of when you would like the session to take place.

There are several different instructional models that are available. Depending on the circumstances, the number of students, room availability, and other factors your instruction session may be in-person in the Library, in-person in your classroom, virtually in your classroom, or virtually to students wherever they are. Each instruction request will be assessed by the faculty member and the librarian to determine the best mode of delivery.

CITY COLLEGE

Faculty and staff have virtual access to over 200 research databases, thousands of electronic books, streaming video, and library research guides through the <u>Library's homepage</u>.



UNIVERSITY ARCHIVES

The collection represents the institutional memory of our University from 1927 to the present. It contains such items as yearbooks, the student newspapers, President's files, Admission publications, annual reports, meeting minutes, and newsletters from various committees and departments.

Montana Memory Project houses several of our collections now in a digital format all accessible through our <u>Special Collections</u> research guide.

Some of the collections digitized are General Bulletins, Graduate Catalogs, City College Catalogs, and the Yearbooks. Another fun collection to view is the photographs from 1930 to 2016, and it is continually growing. Lastly, read about what the students were doing in their own words through the student newspapers, which are housed through Montana Newspapers.
