Program Specific Information

- Students must earn a grade of "C" or higher in the Pre-Paramedic Core requirements, have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA, and possess current National Registry EMT certification to be considered for admission into the program based on an application to the program.
- Applications are due in July of each year.
- 18 students per year will be accepted into the program based on their application.

- When accepted, the program is a **fall only start** and will finish the following summer.
- All students who are accepted into the Paramedic program may need to pass a criminal background check and drug testing to be accepted into the clinical settings. The total cost for both is around \$60.00.
- Accepted students need to be in Billings for the fall and spring semesters, but can make the appropriate arrangements with the Paramedic Program Director and finish in the summer elsewhere if they would like.
- The National Registry EMT certification can fulfill the Restricted Elective requirement in the program. Consult with your Academic Advisor on how this certification can be processed for credit to fulfill the Restricted Elective.
- The curriculum consists of classroom instruction with a skills laboratory, inhospital clinical practice, and a supervised field internship to prepare students for the National Registry EMT-Paramedic Exam and entry-level paramedic practice.
- This program is also nationally accredited by Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for EMS Professions (CoAEMSP) and the Commission of Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP.).
- Students that earn an AAS degree and want to further their education and thus career, are able to go on for a Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) degree through MSUB. Students can focus on various thematic concentrations to earn the BAS degree, but one thematic concentration option is in Emergency Medical Services Management.
