I. ITEM – FIRST READING

Item 56 MEd Interdisciplinary Studies Option: Teacher Licensure Program of Study. Modification of an existing program.

It was noted that this change removes one three-credit course from the Professional Core, because it has become inappropriate for the degree. There are no issues associated with the credit reduction for accreditation or teacher certification.

II. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

A. Academic Senate Budget Committee

Keith Edgerton stated that he dropped the ball on restarting the Budget Committee and asking the Chancellor for all of the budgetary information. The inactive Senate Budget Committee was superseded by the University Budget Committee because the Senate Committee did not allow the administrators to vote. The Senate was going to change the voting rights so that the Chancellor would agree to turn over all the budgets.

Craig McKenzie agreed to join the group as a COT representative.

- ⇒ Motion by Keith Edgerton, seconded by Mark Hardt to **revise the Academic** Senate Bylaws, Article IV, Section B, 3. Budget Committee, to strike the College of Professional Studies and Lifelong Learning and include the College of Allied Health Professions.

C. Volunteer Needed for Committee for Selection of Faculty Award Winners Single meeting on Wednesday, March 14, 11:00 to 2:00 – lunch will be served

It was noted that the Senate has not been asked for a volunteer previously, so this is good.

Johanna Mitchell agreed to serve on the committee.

D. Percentage of Part-Time Faculty that Teach MSU-B Classes

It was noted that the Provost is not here today, but the Senate needs to have this discussion with him. Some research will be done on the percentage of part-time faculty, general education courses taught by part-time faculty, online courses taught by part-time faculty, and so on.

E. HB525 "Intellectual Diversity"

Tedee Cuomo stated that students went to Helena to speak on HB525, but there were not many professors present. It would greatly help the case if some academics were there. Ms. Cuomo noted that the bill was not voted on in committee, so it will end up in the House.

Dr. Rietz requested that the ASMSU-B send their resolution to the Academic Senate, and the date HB525 will come up again.

It was noted that the faculty union recently sent out some contact information so that faculty may contact their Montana representatives about HB525. The Senate could send that information again, when HB525 comes up again, which will probably be in April.
