The U.S. Department of Justice's Office on Violence against Women defines domestic violence as "a pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another intimate partner." It includes, but is not limited to, physical aggression. "Domestic violence can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic, or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person. This includes any behaviors that intimidate, manipulate, humiliate, isolate, frighten, terrorize, coerce, threaten, blame, hurt, injure, or wound someone" (OVW, 2014). This film explores ways that communities are working toward ending violence against women and girls.
