Montana State University Billings RN to BSN Degree Completion Program Fact Sheet

Program Description:

Montana State University Billings Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Completion Program advances nurses' careers by preparing nurses for a range of practice environments, for administrative duties, and for graduate education (including advanced practice nursing to provide access to care in underserved areas of Montana). All nursing courses in the program are offered in an online format.

Program Purpose:

To build upon the Registered Nurse's prior knowledge and prepare graduates to practice theory and research based nursing interventions in a complex healthcare system.

Acceptance in the BSN program is based on:

- 1. Admission to Montana State University Billings.
- 2. Submission of official transcripts from all colleges/universities for evaluation.
- 3. Evidence of a current unencumbered Montana license as a Registered Nurse (RN) and/or proof of scheduled NCLEX exam date.

Background Check

Students are not required to complete a background check as students are required to hold an unencumbered RN license through the state in which they live. The Program Coordinator will pull a current verification of licensure upon acceptance into the RN to BSN program. Students are not doing direct patient care, they are completing faculty-led clinical mentors activities and projects in this program.

Immunization:

If you were born after December 31, 1956, submit proof of immunization that was administered after December 31, 1967. The immunization dates must also be after your first birthday. Requirements include proof of two (2) doses of immunization against measles (Rubeola) and two (2) doses of immunization against Rubella given at least 30 days apart. Include month/day/year. Any immunizations administered after June 11, 1993, must be an MMR. A physician, health agency, or school official must sign the record. Proof of immunization will be required once the student is accepted into the Program.

Learning System Requirements

The Learning System Requirements used at Montana State University Billings is Desire to Learn.

General Information

A grade of "C" or higher is required for all nursing courses (NRSG) AND a "C-" or higher is required for all non-nursing courses within the Degree Completion Program curriculum. If a student receives a grade lower than a "C+" in the same nursing course twice or accumulates two grades of "W", that student must wait one year before being eligible for readmission. Degree Completion students must complete the program within **three (3) years** of being admitted.

Completion of a degree in nursing is costly. In addition to tuition and fees, students should be aware that required nursing textbooks/reference materials are expensive and that courses may require several texts. Once accepted into the Degree Completion Program, students are assessed an \$800 program fee each semester. There is also a distance-learning fee of \$20 per credit per courses.

Please be aware many of the courses are only offered once a year. The student should work with his/her advisor to make certain a plan of study/advising worksheet is completed with this in mind.
