Jazz Club: John Roberts and Alex Bush

- -Jazz festival is the biggest event of the year for the club, and students are now being more involved in the planning.
- -Have had as many as 19 school ensembles come in and work with world-class artists. The event gets kids more excited about jazz. There is a concert at the end of the day, and the community is welcome.
- -Funding goes toward guest artists, adjudicators and lodging, food, and travel
- -There is also a faculty jazz concert tomorrow in Cisel Recital Hall. April 11th is the Big Band concert.
- -Financial board recommended a higher amount than the club requested in order to allow the club to seek new growth.

Student United Way: Haylee Mooney

- -Student United Way is a volunteer organization that is currently going through a transition phase after changing departments three times, having a new advisor, and losing several executive committee members.
- -The goal for next year is to assist other clubs and organizations in planning their own volunteer projects while striving to build membership and complete a few larger projects.
- -Funding will go toward stipends for executive members and large projects.
- -Financial board recommends less than the requested amount due to surplus money that wasn't used this year. Funding was cut from every line item. After discussion, Bus. Manager Shay will reconfigure the line items to allow more money available for executive committee member stipends, allowing room for growth. The overall budget value will remain the same.

Student Activities Board (SAB): Amy Blaquiere and Lili Delgadillo

- -Every event put on by SAB is free to students.
- -Events include: movie nights, free cafeteria dinner, Sip 'n Paint, homecoming, game nights, party at the Pub Station, Be a Hero Week, etc. The majority of funds go toward programs. For example, Party at the Pub Station in April is requiring \$7,000 toward performers. Comedians and performers on average cost between \$2,500 and \$3,000.

-Sip 'n Paint draws 70 students on average. 90 students attended roller skating. Party at the Pub last year drew 300 students (MSUB and Rocky). Dinner in the Caf saw around 150, and the comedian last Thursday drew 75 students.

- -Plan to work more with other organizations and help them out with funds.
- -Financial board recommends less than the requested amount because of the excess funds from this year. After further discussion, some of the surplus is due to two executive members stepping down from their roles and no longer receiving stipends that were budgeted for. Also, SAB will have a new role in Welcome Week and summer orientations; the financial aspects of the club's responsibility in these events is yet to be determined.

The Retort:

- -Located by Rimrock Hall.
- -Currently working to create a streamlined app and better website. Also looking to get more people involved. Holding events for press review, encouraging students to write. Also doing outreach to other programs.
- -Funding would go toward a mobile platform.
- -Financial board recommends the requested amount.

Northcutt Steele Gallery:

- -Art gallery on 1st floor of the Liberal Arts building.
- -Brings in local, national, and international artists. Also hosts senior thesis shows, capstones, and artwork by other clubs. Jon Lodge, a local professional artist, had a recent exhibition and an informal gallery talk.
- One goal is to reflect the community's culture and also show that MSUB is thriving.
- Funding goes toward bringing artists here, equipment for installation, giving awards, holding receptions, and sometimes having live music.
- -Financial board recommends more than the requested amount after taking into consideration the expense of shipping artwork as well as paying for insurance. The \$900 that was cut from SUW was put toward this club.

Intertribal Powwow: Walter RunsAbove

- -The Native American Achievement Center is located at 2630 Normal Ave.
- -Different events are put on, including a freshman initiation night, handgame, and the annual MSUB Powwow. Currently trying to get Native American students into other clubs/organizations and be more involved.
- -MSUB Powwow: April 5th and 6th. There will be a basketball tournament around 1pm and powwow at 6pm on Friday. On Saturday, breakfast at 10am and powwow at 12pm.
- Financial board recommends more than the requested amount due to new insight into what it truly costs to put on the powwow. Sodexo takes much of the revenue from the event, but the Native American Achievement Center should also profit.
