A RESOLUTION TO: INCREASE STUDENT ACCESS TO FACILITIES

#### THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF MSU-BILLINGS ENACTS:

WHEREAS, the facilities on the University Campus of MSU Billings are not accessible or accommodating to students; AND

WHEREAS, this encourages students to leave our campus, especially on the weekends; AND

WHEREAS, students leaving campus are more likely to be exposed to COVID-19 and infect others on campus; AND

WHERAS, there is thus a connection between facility availability and the safety of our students; AND

WHEREAS, the Library is closed on Saturdays and is open from 4:00 to 8:00 on Sundays; AND

WHEREAS, the Recreation Center is closed on Saturdays and only open from 1:00 to 5:00 on Sundays; AND

WHEREAS, Stingers is only open from 7:30am to 3:00pm on weekdays and closed on weekends; AND

WHEREAS, Jazzman's is only open from 7:30am to 2:00pm on weekdays and closed on weekends; AND

WHEREAS, Sub Connect is only open from 10:00am to 2:00pm on weekdays and closed on weekends; AND

WHEREAS, the Student Union Building closes at 7pm on Fridays and Saturdays; AND

WHEREAS, Rimrock Café is only open from 5pm-6pm on Fridays and Saturdays for dinner; AND

WHEREAS, campus buildings are often unavailable to students for the purpose of studying; AND

WHEREAS, student representatives have communicated these issues with members of the MSU Billings administration on multiple occasions in person; AND
