**GNAC PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK:** McCade Olsen, Alaska Anchorage (F, 6-8, Sr., Riverton, UT – Eastern Wyoming) scored 36 points and had 12 rebounds in leading the Seawolves to two road victories. Olsen made 14 of 23 shots and also had three assists in the two wins, which included a GNAC recordsetting defensive performance in a 66-42 victory at Saint Martin's. In the latter game, he held the Saints' Bill Richardson to four points, nine below his season average.

**HONORABLE MENTION:** Kevin Atkins, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-6, So., Long Beach, CA) scored 44 points and also had 14 rebounds. Atkins had 22 points in Saturday's six-point win at Western Oregon as UAF snapped a six-game losing streak. . Nate Jackson, Central Washington (G, 6-0, 178, Sr., Seattle, WA – Cleveland) scored 46 points and had six assists and four steals. Jackson made 16 of 22 shots. . Rob Will, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-10, Sr., Seattle, WA – O'Dea) scored 45 points and had 23 rebounds. Will made 17 of 23 shots, however, he did not block a shot in either game. He ranks second in GNAC history in blocks per game (1.97) with 140 in 71 career contests.

AROUND THE GNAC: Alaska Anchorage broke the GNAC record for fewest points allowed in a conference game in its 66-42 win at Saint Martin's. The previous record was 46. . .Ira Graham's school-record string of consecutive games in which he led or tied Western Washington in scoring was snapped at 10 (9 this season) in Thursday's 82-63 win at Northwest Nazarene. Two other GNAC players – Brad Oleson of Alaska Fairbanks in 2004 and Central Washington's Lance Den Boer in 2007 – also have had 10-game stretches in which they led or tied their respective teams in scoring. . For the second time this season, Saint Martin's Jake Linton has made 28 consecutive free throws. He made 19 of 19 last week, including 18 in Thursday's win over Alaska Fairbanks. Earlier this season Linton made his first 28 free throws after ending the 2006-07 season with 16 in a row to set a GNAC record with 44 in a row.

NON-CONFERENCE RECORDS: GNAC teams finished their non-conference schedules with a 60-35 record, the third best record in league history. The best non-conference record (65-27) came in 2005-06 when all 10 schools posted winning non-conference records and five qualified for the playoffs. The GNAC ended up 20-13 record against other West Region teams, including 15-10 against the CCAA. Cal State San Bernardino accounted for five of the CCAA's 10 victories. Against all Division II teams, GNAC squads posted a .631 winning percentage (41-24).

#### **TEAM NOTES**

**Alaska Anchorage:** Carl Arts had team-highs of 42 points (17-31 FG, 5-11 three-pointers), 14 rebounds, six steals and three blocks as the Seawolves earned only their second two-game conference road sweep in the seven-year history of the GNAC. The only other time they accomplished that feat was on Feb. 6 and Feb. 8, 2003 when they swept Saint Martin's and Central Washington. . .The Seawolves shot 50 percent (51-102) and had only 21 turnovers. Arts increased his career rebounding total to 601, becoming only the 11<sup>th</sup> player in GNAC history to record 600 or more rebounds.

Alaska Fairbanks: Keven Campbell scored 33 points and had team-highs of six assists and seven steals as the Nanooks split two road games. Mike Titus had 30 points and tied Atkins for most rebounds with 14. Titus was five of eight from the three-point line and Campbell made four of five. ..UAF was charged with a GNAC-record 39 fouls and five players fouled out in Thursday's overtime loss at Saint Martin's. The previous record was 37 by Seattle Pacific against Alaska Anchorage on Feb. 19, 2005.

**Central Washington:** The Wildcats had a plus 15 takeaway advantage as it split two games. On the season, CWU leads the GNAC in takeaways with a plus 4.82 advantage. The Wildcats, however, were outrebounded 71-51...CWU is 4-5 at Brougham Pavilion, winning three of the last four, since the formation of the conference. During that time, Seattle Pacific has lost a grand total of only 17 home games.

Montana State Billings: Aaron Terry scored 29 points and John Brooks had 24 in a pair of games. Jeff Miner led the Yellowjackets with 17 in their 120-81 loss to Seattle University. .MSUB has lost 14 straight games, including its final two contests of the 2006-07 season.

**Northwest Nazarene:** Northwest Nazarene overcame a 19-point deficit to beat Central Washington Saturday, scoring 40 points in the final 9:20. The Crusaders were led by Tyler Roberts with 33 points, including 20 against the Wildcats.

Roberts made nine of 15 shots, including five of eight three-pointers. He also converted on 10 of 12 free throws.

Saint Martin's: Saint Martin's made only six of 32 three-pointers in splitting in pair of games with the two Alaska schools. Jake Linton made 18 free throws against UAF to equal a GNAC single-game record for conference games for most free throws made and most made without a miss. The record for all games is 19 by Ryan Diggs of Western Washington against Sonoma State on Nov. 25, 2005.

**Seattle:** Seattle University's 120 points in Saturday's 39-point win at Montana State Billings was the eighth highest total in GNAC history and the fourth highest in a conference game. Michael Knight and Chris Gweth both came off the bench to score 20 points. Both players missed only one shot. Knight made eight of nine. Gweth converted on six of seven.

Seattle Pacific: Marques Echols was perfect from the foul line, making 17 of 17 and scoring 38 points. He also had six rebounds and six assists. He came into the weekend shooting just 69 percent from the foul line (20 of 29). . The Falcons went 0 for 10 from the three-point line in Saturday's win over Western Washington. It is just the second time in GNAC history a team has failed to make a trey in a conference game. The only other time came on Jan. 11, 2003 when Western Washington went 0 for 4 from the arc against SPU.

**Western Oregon:** Travis Kuhns scored 41 points and had 11 rebounds, 11 assists and six steals. Kuhns scored half his points from the foul line (21 of 25). Adonal Arrington had 30 points and 17 rebounds, while Mike McLaughlin contributed 24 points and 16 rebounds.

**Western Washington:** Ira Graham scored 32 points and Steve Alford had 36 points, 15 rebounds and four steals. Graham was 16 of 26 as the Vikings shot 50.4 percent, while holding their opponents to a 41.3 percentage.

GNAC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK: Alira Carpenter, Montana State Billings (G, 5-8, Jr., Lewiston, MT – Fergus County) scored 53 points as the Yellowjackets had two second-half comebacks in Alaska. Carpenter had 27 points against Alaska Fairbanks including 11 in a 18-0 run as MSUB rallied for a 60-51 win. She netted 26 points against Alaska Anchorage, including 10 in the second half when the 'Jacks rallied from a 49-31 deficit before losing by two. In the two games, Carpenter accounted for 42 percent of MSUB's point total, making 19 of 38 shots, nine of 20 from the arc. She also converted all six of her foul shots.

HONORABLE MENTION: Ashley Thompson, Alaska Anchorage (F, 5-10, Jr., McCammon, ID – Marsh Valley) scored 24 points, including two key baskets in the final two minutes as the Seawolves kept alive their home winning streak with a two-point win over Montana State Billings. She made nine of 13 shots in two games, scoring 12 against the Yellowjackets and 12 against Seattle University. She made three of four three-pointers and had eight rebounds. . .Kelsey Hill, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-2, Jr., Portland, OR – Portland Christian) made nine of 12 shots and had 15 rebounds to lead the Falcons to their 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> wins in a row. Hill had 19 points in the two contests. . .Kassie Ludeman, Saint Martin's (F, 6-2, Sr., Waterville, WA) led the Saints to a home split with 32

points, 12 rebounds and seven assists. Ludeman made 13 of 23 shots. She also had two blocks.

**AROUND THE GNAC:** Hanna Hull of Central Washington became the 29<sup>th</sup> member of the GNAC 1000-Point Club Saturday scoring 10 to increase her total to 1,007 in a 86-69 win over Western Washington. . The next in line to reach that coveted total are Kari Reabold of Alaska Fairbanks and Laina Sobczak of Seattle University, who have 944 and 921, respectively. Rebecca Kielpinski of Alaska Anchorage needs 13 more rebounds to become the ninth player to reach 700 in that category.

NON-CONFERENCE RECORDS: Through the non-conference portion of the schedule, this season has been the most successful in GNAC history. GNAC teams posted a conference-record .723 winning percentage. Three teams completed their non-conference schedule unbeaten. Only three teams in GNAC history — Seattle Pacific in 2002-03 and 2003-04 and Alaska Anchorage in 2006-07 — had previously accomplished that feat. . Conference teams ended up 50-25 record in Division II games and 37-17 in West Region games (21-0 against the PacWest, 16-17 against the CCAA).

# **TEAM NOTES**

**Alaska Anchorage:** Rebecca Kielpinski had 28 points, 22 rebounds and 11 assists and recorded her 32<sup>nd</sup> career double-double as the Seawolves extended their school-record home winning streak to 27 games, including 23 at the Wells Fargo Sports Complex. Kielpinski made 10 of 16 shots, including her only three-point attempt.

**Alaska Fairbanks:** Kari Reabold had 28 points and Cristina Bruketta scored 22 in home losses to Seattle and MSU Billings. Joscelyn Shumate had a team-best 14 rebounds. UAF was outshot 38.9 to 32.4 and outrebounded 96-71.

**Central Washington:** The Wildcats extended their winning streak to nine and snapped a nine-game losing streak to their arch-rivals with a 17-point road win over Western Washington

Saturday. It was CWU's first win over the Vikings since 2003 and their first at Bellingham since 2002.

**Montana State Billings**: Shantell Marquis scored 18 points and led MSUB with 12 assists and five steals. Dani Henderson had 17 points and tied Kayla Ryan for rebound honors with 11 each.

**Northwest Nazarene:** Kristin Hein had team-bests of 39 points, 21 rebounds and five blocks and also had six steals as the Crusaders won two of three games, including a non-conference contest Monday against College of Idaho (formerly known as Albertson). Lindsay Brady also had 39 points in the three contests.

Saint Martin's: In addition to Ludeman, the Saints got doublefigure scoring from six other players, including 16 from Amber Harmon and 15 each from Krissy Bassett and Michelle Short in their two-game home stand.

**Seattle:** Laina Sobczak led the Redhawks with 31 points and 13 rebounds on their road trip to Alaska. Sobczak made 12 of 18 shots and had seven offensive rebounds.

**Seattle Pacific:** The Falcons outshot their opponents 51.2 to 31.9 in a pair of double-digit road victories. Nine players scored between 11 and 25 points in the two contests. SPU shot 50 percent from the arc (16-32), while holding Saint Martin's and Western Oregon to eight treys in 31 attempts.

**Western Oregon:** Katie Torland had 35 points and Alison Crumb had 20 for the Wolves in their home losses to Northwest Nazarene and Seattle Pacific. The Wolves were outshot 50.8 to 42.2 percent and turned the ball over 55 times in the two losses.

Western Washington: Claire Pallansch and Amanda Dunbar each had 16 points and Gabby Wade had 12 rebounds for the Vikings in their home loss to CWU. The Vikings have lost four straight and eight of their last nine.
