3. Recruitment scholarship update and proposal

Cheri, Tammi and Emily shared information on the promise scholarship data and data on scholarships awarded from the financial aid office.

Conversation around data included in the spreadsheets linked above regarding recruiting and retention. The Promise scholarship is intended to be a recruiting tool (first time freshman receive the scholarship based on academic achievement for the first year) and the scholarships awarded from the financial aid office are ongoing.

The data show that students receiving the promise scholarship are retaining and completing at a higher level than the average MSUB student.

Promise is one way to incentivize student to attend.
