What are the average annual wages and potential lifetime earnings for professionals working in the Health Administration field?

Occupation	Annual Mean Wage in MT*	Potential Lifetime Earnings*
Health Services Manager	\$129,350 - \$144,990	\$110,680 x 39 yrs = \$4,316,520
Clinic Human Resources Manager	\$76,170 - \$118,860	\$136,350 x 39 yrs = \$5,317,650
Health Information Technologist	\$63,830 - \$71,830	\$62,990 x 39 yrs = \$2,456,610
Community Health Specialist	\$50,930 - \$55,020	\$48,200 x 39 yrs = \$1,879,800

* Based on the 2023 state mean and national median wage of occupation per the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. Lifetime earnings are based on the national median wage.

What percentage of Health Administration graduates report having a job after graduating?

Out of the 50% of 2023 Health Administration graduates that we received graduate data on, **100%** reported being employed* after graduation.
