Occupation	Annual Mean Wage in MT*	Potential Lifetime Earnings*
Music Teacher, (K-12) ⁺	\$32,110 - \$59,000	\$65,220 x 39 yrs = \$2,543,580
Music Director, Choir/Band	\$44,450 - \$59,060	\$62,590 x 39 = \$2,442,010
Sound Engineer Technician	\$39,210 - \$55,120	\$59,430 x 39 yrs = \$2,317,770
Event/Promotion Coordinator	\$39,840 - \$51,130	\$56,920 x 39 yrs = \$2,219,880

What percentage of Music graduates report having a job after graduating?

Out of the 100% of 2023(Program) graduates who responded to MSUB'S Graduate Survey, Music Performance (100%) Music Teaching (67%) reported being *employed after graduation.
