Year 7 EIE Visit Debrief

Kathleen Thatcher reported that she has received the preliminary report on MSUB's Year 7 EIE Visit. She is working to complete the fact and error check. Information contained in the report cannot be shared until it is finalized, which is expected to be completed by early November. Discussion followed on how and when to share feedback from the review team.

Artificial Intelligence and Search Engines: Why It Matters

Dan Carter led discussion based on an article (see attached) that he shared, entitled "How to Detect AI Writing Using These Tips" by Rachel Kane. Cabinet members discussed the limitations of information available to AI and the resulting inaccurate material that can be produced as a result.

Provost Vartanian provided an overview of some of the discussions from the AI summit he and other MSUB employees attended last month that was hosted by the Office of the Commissioner of Higher Education.

NCAA Legislation Update (to be voted on at the next convention in January 2026)

• *Intent:* To amend the seasons of competition legislation, as follows: (1) To permit a student-athlete to engage in five seasons of intercollegiate competition in any one sport

during their first 10-semesters or 15-quarters of full-time enrollment; (2) To eliminate the currently legislated waivers and exceptions associated with the seasons of competition legislation; and (3) To amend the waivers and exceptions for the period of eligibility, as specified.

• Intent: To add women's flag football as an emerging sport for women and establish legislation related to membership, financial aid and playing and practice seasons, as specified.

This week, I am traveling to Helena and Great Falls to participate in two alumni outreach events and the Montana Chapter of AFP (Association of Fundraising Professionals) Educational Summit.

To date, we have raised \$592,260 in fundraised dollars (cash) for FY26 and have \$2,367,202 committed for the new Sculpture and Ceramic Studio (donors have five years to fulfil their pledge). This 21% of the goal for the new building. Our first *Next Is Now* Steering Committee meeting was held on October 2.

Upcoming events include alumni outreach gatherings in Helena on October 21 and Great Falls on October 23, as well as a 50 Years of Women's Basketball alumni celebration on November 7–8, hosted in partnership with Athletics.
