- Students who want to continue into a Bachelor degree within the MSUB College of Business, should take CAPP 131 instead of CAPP 120.
- If a student is working towards the Associate of Science, it is not recommended that students take all seven credits of science in the same semester.
- When planning for classes, consult with program advisor. There are several courses that are only offered in specific semesters.
- BGEN 294 is typically taken towards the end of completing this degree.
- Several of the required courses will transfer to the College of Business Core and College of Business as general electives towards completing a bachelor degree.
- Students who would like to pursue the College of Business, should choose ACTG 202, STAT 216 and/or WRIT 220 as Restricted Electives.
