Introduction

The first version of the Mountain States Poll was conducted by Dr. Craig Wilson in 1989. At that time, it was known as the Eastern Montana College Poll. The name changed to the Mountain States Poll in 2019. This is the 36th version of the Poll. The following report reflects the responses of a statewide random sample of 657 Montanans. Responses were collected between October 2-13, 2023. The Poll was conducted using phone and online sampling methods, with 210 responses from phone calls and 447 responses from online responses. The margin of error is 3.82%, with various subgroups having larger margins of error. The results are weighted based on data from the Census.

For phone responses, we used the Random Digit Dialing (RDD) technique, and phone numbers were provided by Scientific Telephone Samples. Phone calls were conducted in the Liberal Arts building at Montana State University Billings. The online responses were collected by Qualtrics using quota sampling. Funding for the Mountain States Poll was provided by the Montana State University Billings Office of the Provost, College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences, and the Department of Social Sciences and Cultural Studies.

If the respondent was not familiar with ranked choice voting, they were supplied with the following explanation:

Ranked choice voting is an electoral system where voters rank all candidates on the ballot in order of preference. If one of the candidates wins a majority of the first preference votes, then that candidate is declared the winner. If **no** candidate gets a majority of the vote, the candidate with the least amount of votes is eliminated, and the ballot is recalculated. If the voter's first choice got eliminated, then the voter's second choice is used. This process repeats until a candidate wins the majority of the votes.
