#### Introduction

Dr. Craig Wilson conducted the first version of the Mountain States Poll – then called the Eastern Montana College Poll – in 1989. The survey was renamed the Mountain States Poll in 2019. This report contains the 37<sup>th</sup> version of the Poll. The following report includes 760 responses from participants across the state of Montana. Responses were collected using a random sampling technique between September 30<sup>th</sup> and October 16<sup>th</sup> (September 30-October 11 for the phone responses and October 4-16 for the online responses). The online sampling method collected 526 responses, and 234 responses were collected via phone. The margin of error is 3.56%, with various subgroups having larger margins of error. Results are weighted based on Census data.

For phone responses, the Random Digit Dialing (RDD) technique was used, and phone numbers were provided by Scientific Telephone Samples. Phone calls were conducted in the Liberal Arts building at Montana State University Billings. Qualtrics quota sampling was used to collect the online responses. Funding for the Mountain States Poll was provided by the Montana State University Billings Office of the Provost, College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences, and the Department of Social Sciences and Cultural Studies.





### 1. Do you plan to vote in the 2024 presidential election?





2. At this point in time, do you approve or disapprove of President Joe Biden's performance in office?








