Individual Education Plan

The IELP offers classes in 130-hour sessions throughout the year. At the start of evrey session, an "Individual Education Plan (IEP)" is developed for each IELP student based on an assessment of the student's current English language skill level determined by a comprehensive English Language examination and personal consultation with their IELP student advisor. The individual Education Plan is then used to guide each student's learning during the session to enable them to achieve specific goals for improving their English language competency level, social and cultural skill development, and preparation for college level

Placement Testing & Level Advancement

At the start of each in-take session, new students will take placement tests which will define the IELP level that the student will start at in the program. The students' IFI P course grades will determine whether the student should continue to the next level or continue at the previous level. Once an undergraduate student has successfully completed Level 6 of the IELP, they will retake the placement test as an exit test as well as the undergraduate placement test required by academia. When those tests are passed, students will have earned an English Language competency which will qualify them to enroll in any MSU Billings degreee program. The same process applies to graduate students but must complete six levels in the IELP.

Program Level Descriptions

Level 1 This level will provide students with foundational English skills in writing, reading, speaking, listening, and culture.

This level will enable students to increase their abilities in English pronunciation, reading and vocabulary, writing and grammar, oral communication, academic skills, and American culture.

Level 3 This level will allow students to synthesize English within academic writing and reading, oral communication, intercultural skills, a second level of academic skills, grammar (both spoken and written), and presentation skills.

Level 4 This level will offer students the opportunity to participate in a university course by observation, take a second level of intercultural skills, another level of academic writing and reading, more oral communication with an emphasis on speeches, and a course on research skills.

> This level will prepare students to enter MSU Billings undergraduate credit courses within their chosen program by offering participation in a credit course, a second level of research skills in a course for research projects, acourse for PowerPoint skills, a higher level of academic writing and reading, and a final level of oral communication. upon successful completion of this level, a student's placement test results will be equivalent to scores needed for enrollment in the required college level English composition course at MSU Billings.

Level 6 This level will prepare students to enter MSU Billings undergrad/grad credit courses within their chosen program. Courses will be focuesd on undergrad/grad academic writing and reading, and oral communication skills. Upon successful completion of this level, a student's placement test results will be equivalent to scores needed for enrollment in credited undergrad/grad level courses at MSU Billings.
