

The City of Billings

Billings is the largest city in Montana and the trade, retail and distribution center for much of Montana, Northern Wyoming, North Dakota, and South Dakota. MSUB is located 1.5km from downtown Billings, walking distance to a plethora of shops, restaurants, cafes and theaters. As a student at MSUB, you will enjoy the advantages of living and studying in a growing city with ample opportunity for social and professional development. Residents and visitors alike enjoy Montana's distinct four seasons and fill their days eating and socializing in the city or exploring the splendor of Montana's natural environment.

CLUBS & ORGANIZATIONS

International Student Clubs and Organizations

MSUB has numerous on-campus clubs and organizations in which exchange students can participate. The most popular club for international students is the MultiCultural Club. International Studies also has a strong support network for international students through its BFF program, which helps to ensure a smooth and pleasant transition to life in Billings, Montana.

MultiCultural Club

The MultiCultural Club celebrates diversity and culture on the MSUB campus by managing various events and activities that aim to create cultural awareness and provide cross-cultural opportunities for students, staff/faculty, and the Billings community. Billings Friendship Families participate by inviting students for home-cooked meals, weekend excursions, and holiday celebrations. On-Campus Convenience

The MSUB campus has everything you need for an active, happy, healthy lifestyle. Two buildings for student housing, Rimrock and Petro Hall, provide comfortable and modern accommodations with plenty of activities nearby. A short walk from student housing is the university cafe, the student store, basketball courts, weight room, climbing wall, swimming pool, tennis and raquetball courts, a game room, and the library.

The campus is a park-like environment filled with trees, flowers, walking paths and a canal that runs through the south-end of campus. The university is surrounded by upper-middle class family homes in one of the most desirable neighborhoods in the Billings community.

The city of Billings experiences little-to-no crime; however, for added safety, the university has on-site security that patrols and safeguards the campus 24 hours a day and student housing can only be accessed using state-of-the-art handprint recognition technology.

Exchange Student Admission:

For admission as an international exchange student, the following basic requirements must be met. Click on the QR Code for more detailed information:



Criteria:

- Be currently enrolled in and nominated by a designated MSUB partner university
- Have at least one semester remaining prior to graduation
- Demonstrate English proficiency. The minimum acceptable score is TOEFL (IBT): 68 / IELTS: 5.5.
 - Exchange students are permitted to submit a letter of verification from a certified English instructor from the partner university indicating that the student's English abilities meets and/or exceeds the minimum admission requirements.
- Have an equivelent of at least a 2.75 GPA
- U.S. Immigration policies require that international students show proof of adequate available financial resources to cover their financial needs for the duration of the exchange

Admission Process:

Step 1: Complete MSUB's international student application and pay the \$30 application fee www.applyweb.com/msubill

Step 2: Email the following supporting application documents to international admissions@msubillings.edu

- Financial statement form and institutional bank letter
- Proof of English language proficiency
- Copies of transcripts or records of previous school work
- Copy of passport

Fall Inbound: May 15 **Spring Inbound:** November 15







On-Campus Living:

Estimated Costs:

Tuition and most fees are waived for exchange students, however, students still must cover the costs for room and board, health insurance, and some fees. In order to obtain a DS-2019 immigration document and a J-1 visa, all exchange students must provide proof of financial means to support their costs abroad. Below is a breakdown of the estimated costs needed to obtain the necessary immigration documents (calculated for 2024-2025).

Airport Pickup & Orientation:

We offer a complimentary airport pick-up for all students. To take advantage of this service, students will need to send their flight itinerary information to ois@msubillings.edu at least 2 weeks prior to the arrival date. We do not offer this service to students who arrive later than 10pm (20:00).

All students also must participate in a mandatory international student orientation prior to the start of the semester. The orientation typically lasts runs three days and is generally held the week prior to the start of classes. Students will receive more information about arrival and orientation via email.
