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INTRODUCTION

To those individuals who have requested a copy of the Montana-Wyoming Foundations Directory, we feel you would also have an interest in being introduced to the Foundation Center, a national service organization supported by foundations. The main offices and libraries are located in New York and Washington, D.C. The Foundation Center is the only national source of factual information on philanthropic giving of larger foundations and corporations throughout the country. The Center has organized a nationwide library network which provides free access to all of the materials necessary to locate funding sources and to develop a good proposal. The Eastern Montana College Library is part of tha network and houses these funding materials.

The Foundations Center collection is located on the first floor of the EMC Library, in a room entitled Grants Assistance Center and is managed and staffed by the Eastern Montana College Foundation. Further information regarding this collection can be obtained by calling the Eastern Montana College Foundation at 657-2337.

Because Eastern houses the regional collection for Montana of the Foundation Center, we are trying to make Montana organizations and services which could benefit from this information on funding aware of this resource.

Our purpose in producing this directory is to assist those individuals who are looking for funding for special projects in Montana and Wyoming. Since it has been our experience that many of the service and proje ts being funded are benefiting residents in both Northern Wyoming and South Central Montana, we have made an attempt to include all foundations in those two states. Six foundations, however, have asked not to be included in the Directory and we have complied with their requests.

The information in this Directory should provide sources of funding available in Montana and Wyoming to individuals seeking support for their projects. It is also our hope to reduce the number of requests being sent to foundaions for projects that are not within that foundation's interest.

The Montana Arts Council and the Montana Committee for the Humanities provide valuable finding for a wide variety of projects in the arts and humanities. THE MONTANA ARTS COUNCIL 1208 South Third West Missoula, MT 59801

The Montana Arts council provides funding to organizations which are chartered in Montana as not-for-profit Federal tax exempt organizations. Grant funds must be matched by cash or in-kind contributions; therefore, the Council will not fund more than 50% of total costs. Also, the fund cannot be matched with other Federal funds.

In-kind contributions are services and other materials donated to an organization. They are defined as contributed supplies or services at the fair market value, those necessary to carry out grant programs and those which are essential to the completion of the program and will be utilized during the project. The sub-grantee must maintain documentation of in-kind contributions.

Council Priorities:

- Programs must be in existance for at least one year as a tax-exempt organization to be eligible.
- 2. Gives priority to Montana citizens.
- 3. The Council places a high priority on those projects that would reach special audiences comprised fo citizens who are not regularly serviced by the arts. These include the handicapped, elderly, lower income groups, institutionalized, ethnic and racial minorities and residents of smaller rurual communitites.
- 4. The Council will support college projects if they are determined to be of benefit to the general public.

Low Priorities:

Funding of scholarships and projects offering free art.

Areas Not Funded:

Permanent equipment, reducing existing deficits, and individuals.

Application Process:

- 1. Supply a copy of Internal Revenue Service Tax-Exempt Form 501 (c) (3) non-profit determination.
- Have the formal approval of the program's Board of Directors to submit the application.

The Montana Committee for the Humanities is a non-profit educational organization which operates under a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities, a Federal agency. The term humanities includes but is not limited to: history, philosophy, languages, linguistics, literature, archaeology, jurisprudence, history and criticism of the arts, ethics, comparative religion, and those aspects of the social sciences employing historical or philosophical approaches.

The Montana Committee for the Humanities has the primary goal of stimulating dialogue between the adult public and humanity scholars. All programs must relate to one of the Committee's themes for 1983-84. These themes are: "Tradition in Transition; Heritage and Challenge: and MOntana and the West: New Directions."

Eligibility:

Any non-profit group, institution, or organization in Montana may apply. These may include: citizen's groups, church groups, colleges, professional associations, etc. Co-sponsorship between one or more non-profit organizatins is encouraged. Individuals are not eligible.

Format:

No limit on format. The Committee encourages new approaches and ideas for projects which meet the grant criteria.

Restrictions:

The Montana Committee for the Humanities cannot support:

- Private research, scholarships, fellowships, cost of writing or production of publication or books or journals.
- Projects which focus on personal instead of public concer.
- Annual meeting or organizations.
- Construction or restoration costs, or the operating expenses of existing organizations.
- Equipment, property, or other capital purchases.
- Museum or library acquisitions.
- Direct social action or planning for direct action, or projects which advocate a particular course of action.
- meals or refreshments for audiences.

Deadlines:

Proposals should be submitted with 18 copies. Grant applications for less than \$10,000 are considered on a monthly basis and applications must be submitted by the 20th of any month. Applications for \$10,000 or more are considered quarterly.

Assistance is Available:

Committee members welcome the opportunity to answer your questions and discuss program ideas. They are also happy to review rough drafts of proposals. Persons planning to submit a grant application are urged to contact the staff before submitting a final proposal. Phone: 243-6022

THE SEARCH FOR GRANTS

Basic Steps in Researching Foundations

1. Develop a broad list of prospects.

What foundations have funded projects similar in some way to yours? Use the FOUNDATIONS GRANTS INDEX (bimonthly and annual) and/or COMSEARCH PRINTOUTS to do this. These publications include grants of \$5,000 or more made to nonprofit organizations and reported to The Foundation Center by over 400 foundations.

What foundations have indicated having a general interest in your subject area?

Use the "Fields of Interest Index" in THE FOUNDATION DIRECTORY and the "Subject Index" to SOURCE BOOK PROFILES to add more names.

2. Narrow your list by eliminating foundations whose own restrictions rule out funding of your project.

Use the entries in THE FOUNDATION DIRECTORY. This book includes descriptive entries for all foundations with assets of \$1 million or grants totaling \$100,000 or more annually. Note if a foundation will give i your goegraphic area, for the type of support you need, etc.

- 3. Research in depth the foundations that are left on your list. Consider:
 - -- subject interest
 - -- geographic preference
 - -- range of giving
 - -- type of support
 - -- type of recipient
 - -- application deadline dates

Identify those most important information to check is the complete list of each foundation's recent grants.

use SOURCE BOOK PROFILES - In depth profiles of the 1,000 largest foundations.

Use the foundation's own published annual report - about 500 foundations provide them.

Use the information returns that each foundation must file with the IRS -- the 990~AR and 990~PF -- available on all private foundations.

Before getting in touch with a foundation, examine all the information available on its application guidelines and requirements. This is available in THE FOUNDATION DIRECTORY, SOURCE BOOK PROFILES, and in the library's vertical files.

PROPOSAL WRITING OUTLINE

Summary

Clearly and consisely summarize the request.

Introduction

Describes agency's qualifications or credibility.

Problem Assessment

The needs to be met or problems that will be solved.

Objectives

Benefits of the funding

Methods

Activities to achieve the desired result

Evaluation

Plan for determining the degree to which those objectives are met.

Future

Plan for continuation beyond the grant period.

Budget

Costs to be met by the funding source and those funds provided by others.

SOME BASIC PRINCIPLES OF PROPOSAL WRITING

1. The Proposal should be Neat, Clean and Easy to Read!

There should be no typographical errors in your final copy. Send an original, with copies only if the funding source requests them. Don't send more than one copy unless you're asked. Break up the copy; nobody wants to look at a proposal that starts at the top of one page and goes on interminably, unbroken by paragraphs or some other breathing space.

Don't use extravagant proposal packaging. Spiral bindings were made to be cut apart, and expensive covers suggest that you waste money. If you employ a very unusual format, perhaps to attract attention, you risk focusing too much attention on the form of your proposal, instead of its content. If you depart from the norm, you had better do it well. One applicant sent out 1,000 proposals, printed in question-and-answer format with questions in blue and answers in red, and received not a single response. Most recipients probably thought the letter was intended for the Bicentennial Commission.

2. Write Your Proposal in English

Proposal writing is not an opportunity to demonstrate your mastery of bureaucratese. Even when your funding source employs jargon in its guidelines, use it only if you feel you must, and define your terms. Each of five panelists reviewing applications in "career education" may have his or her own understanding of what it is; tell them what you think it is.

To test the clarity of your writing, have friends or family read your proposal. Some of your best comments will come from people unfamiliar with your field, not operating on the same assumptions as you, and unfamiliar with your jargon. Merely passing a proposal around your agency has limitations. Staff may think they know what you mean, or may be less than critical because of your role (or theirs).

3. Make It Brief

What is the proper length for a proposal? Just long enough for you to clearly communicate your message, but not long enough to produce a stuper. a ten-page proposal can leave readers hungering for more; a two-page proposal can still put them to sleep.

4. Be Positive

Get yourself 'up" for the proposal-writing experience. Remember that you are offering the funding source an opportunity to participate in an important, useful activity. Writing for grant support is not like writing home from college for money. You don't have to apologize. You're an applicant, not a supplicant! Don't beg! Remember that the funding source gets its credibility from funding winners, not losers. Few grant-making agencies want to provide you with you last grand on the road to oblivion.

Don't call attention to your mistakes. The funding source will learn about them soon enough, hopefully in discussion where you can give more information. Don't say something like:

We are sure that you are aware of the sudden departure of our fiscal officer some three years ago, and the subsequent investigations of this agency by the General Accounting Office. We have made great strides since that time, have replaced several members of our board of directors, and have employed a former top GSA official to oversee our fiscal matters.

5. Avoid Unsupported Assumptions

The astute reader finds any number of unsupported assumptions in most grant applications. These fall into a variety of categories:

- The funding source is told nothing about the applicant agency because the grant seeker is sure that the funding source knows all about them.
- The national scope of a problem is described, but there is not documentation of its existence in the the community served by the grant seeker.
- A casual relationship between events is presumed, but no evidence of cause and effect is presented.

The assumptions that find their way into proposals are limitless. Sometimes the applicant leads into an assumption by saying "we believe." Supporting "beliefs" with evidence and documentation is a check on logic, produces a more coherent proposal, and demonstrates your expertise to the funding source. Present enough evidence to support your position, and no more. Don't overkill! Pages of tables, charts and graphs will probably not be read, and too often fail to support the thesis of the proposal writer. Cite source sof data in the body of the proposal and avoid footnotes. Don't develop a doctoral dissertation.

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THE COVER LETTER

Proposals to foundations and corporations are usually accompanied by a cover letter. This is a letter signed by the chairperson of the board of directors of a nonprofit agency, or individual in high authority in a governmental applicant agency. Its purpose is primarily to assure the funding source that the proposal is endorsed by the board, which is the only authority that can bind the applicant. The board of directors may have given this authority to executive director of the agency, but it is still a good idea to have the cover letter come from the desk of the board chairperson, on the letter head of the applicant agency.

The cover letter should briefly describe the content of the proposal; it should not be used in place of the proposal summary. This is because the cover letter may be detached from the proposal, which would then be reviewed unaccompanied by a summary. This can have unfortunate consequences..

The cover letter is also the place to commit to following up on the proposal, e.g.:

"We would welcome the opportunity to meet with you and to provide further information on . . ." or "I and Ms. Blank of our staff will be in New York City during the early part of next month and would lik to meet with you at your convenience."

A cover letter may seem like a simple proposition, but there are a few things to look out for:

- Don't boldly proclaim your sophisticated funding source research, such as "knowing of your interest in the problems of the elderly." This could be seen as patronizing, intimidating or "show-off" approach. If the funding source is interested in a particular program area, the fact that your proposal has focused on that area speaks for itself.
- Non't tell the readers that they should fund your proposal, such as: "We know that you will find this proposal to be of the greatest significance," or "surely it is obvious to you that "
- Conversely, don't get on your knees, and sign off the cover letter "with a wing and a prayer" or "supplicatingly yours."
- Address your letter to a specific person at the funding source. Make sure you know who the right person is, get the spelling of his/her name right, make sure he/she is still alive, and never send the proposal "To whom it may concern" or "Gentlepersons."
