The Montana Foundation Directory, 1997 edition, has been compiled and published by The Grants Center at Montana State University-Billings. The other collections are located in Helena at the Montana State Library (800-338-5087 / 406-444-3004), Bozeman at the Bozeman Public Library (406-582-2402), and Missoula at the Mike and Maureen Mansfield Library at the University of Montana (406-243-6800). It is generally appropriate to call ahead for hours of collection availability.

The Foundation Center is an independent national service organization established by foundations to provide a source of information on foundation and corporate giving. The Foundation Center Library is located at 79 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue, New York, NY, 10003-3067 (212-620-4230 / 800-424-9836). The Montana Foundation Directory lists private foundations in Montana and out-of-state foundations known to have contributed in Montana. The information has been obtained from a variety of resources including IRS Private Foundation form 990 (PF990), Foundation Center directories and *FC Database on CD-ROM*, and personal contact with foundation officers, directors, and trustees. The 1997 edition provides additional information not available in previous editions, such as (where available) application information, grant notes, and a more detailed purpose and restrictions description.
