Carl Castles called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. in the Chancellor's Conference Room.

The minutes of November 1 were accepted as presented.

## I. ITEMS – FIRST READING

Item 14 M 105 Contemporary Mathematics. Change prerequisite and course description.

- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Ying Wang to **approve Item 14 on first** reading.

Mark Jacobson, Chair of Mathematics, stated that they agree to change the prerequisite to "Appropriate placement score."

- Motion carried.
- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Ying Wang to waive second reading of Item 14.
- Motion carried.

The Committee agreed Item 14 will go to the Senate as a consent item.

- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Joseph Bryan to **approve Items 16 through 16.k on first reading.** 

It was noted that several programs besides History now use HSTA 200 Historian as Detective as an option for a writing course, including the above Art programs. The course description of HSTA 200 says it is designed for History majors. Keith Edgerton, Chair of History, noted that they should probably update the course description.

The Committee agreed Items 16 through 16.k will go to the Senate as action items.

**Item 28** BS Major in Outdoor Adventure Leadership. Modification to an existing program, includes adding a 2+2 "track" for Fire Science students.

- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Ying Wang to **approve Item 28 on first** reading.

Clinton Culp, Health & Human Performance, noted that the Fire Science folks are fully on board with this idea. The students coming out of Fire Science will be able to step right into the Outdoor Adventure Leadership program.

It was noted that the Fire Science-Business 2+2 program was just deleted. How is this different? Kelly McCoy, Fire Science Program, noted that about 100 firefighters die every year, but the firefighters in high risk teams have a much lower rate of death, because of their additional training. The additional training firefighters need is directly in line with the Outdoor Adventure Leadership program. Graduates will have expanded safety skills and expanded employability. Interest in this area among Fire Science students is good, and Mr. McCoy can steer students into the bachelor program.

**Item 15** Teaching Minor in Earth Science. Modification to an existing program.

- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Ying Wang to **approve Item 15 on first reading.** 

Sarah Friedman noted that GPHY 111 & 112 are no longer being offered, so they are removed from the program. Instead, they are adding ERTH 303 Weather and Climate, as well as a choice between GEO 309 Sedimentation and Stratigraphy and a GEO 491 titled Topics in Igneous/Metamorphic Petrology. It was noted that adding a 491 course to a program can be problematic, since any course with the GEO 491 number would count in Banner. It became clear there was miscommunication regarding new courses. Dr. Friedman agreed to take out the 491 from the program at this time and will add it for the next catalog as a new course.

The Committee agreed Item 15 will go to the Senate as an action item.

**Item 29** EDU 497B Methods: 5-12 Mathematics. Change title to Methods: 9-12 Mathematics and change credits from 2 to 3.

- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Ying Wang to **approve Item 29 on first reading.** 

Cori Hart, Educational Theory & Practice, noted that high school math teachers do need that additional credit. It was noted that the course description should not say "middle school," so it was corrected.

It was noted that the teaching major and minor are affected by this. Program modifications are on the way.

**Item 21** HSTR 440 Topics in Southern Asia since 1750. Change title to Topics in Asian History and change course description.

Dr. Egerton noted that the faculty member who taught this course has retired and another faculty member now teaches it, requiring an update. The course description was shortened slightly and the effective date was changed to Fall 2018.

- Motion carried.

The Committee agreed Item 21 will go to the Senate as a consent item.

Item 30 HADM 355 Rural/Frontier Health Care Delivery. Delete course.

These courses have not been offered in years and are being deleted. It was noted that HADM 452 is still listed as a restricted elective in the Health Administration program, but Tom Dell, Chair of the CAHP Curriculum Committee, said the program change is on the way.

Item 31.f REHA 298 Cooperative Education/Internship. Delete course.

**Item 31.g** REHA 303 Assistive Technology Applications Across the Lifespan. Delete course.

- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Joseph Bryan to **approve Items 31 through 31.g on first reading.** 

Tom Dell, Chair of Rehabilitation & Human Services, stated that the Human Services program has always had a math requirement. This change will add REHA 406 Assessment in Human Service and Addiction Programs as a choice for the math course, since at least half of REHA 406 is focused on statistics. While a student is allowed to count other courses for math, with advisor approval, this will make it easier for students to understand REHA 406 can count in the math requirement.

Dr. Dell noted that the course changes are to clean up some prerequisite headaches for the Rehab program and get rid of courses no longer used. The prerequisite was updated for HS 335 and HS 385.
