## 1965-2025 **TRIO** 60 Years Strong

#### **Efficiency & Waste Reduction**

TRIO programs are funded based on enrollment and performance benchmarks, making it one of the most accountable programs in the federal government. Each TRIO program is evaluated by specific measurable outcome objectives as defined by each approved grant proposal, and must annually meet these objectives and enrollment numbers to preserve funding.

#### "Insurance" on the Pell Grant

TRIO's Student Support Services (SSS) and McNair programs are proven effective at helping low-income Pell Grant recipients with completing college requirements and finishing their post-secondary education.

#### **TRIO Effectiveness**

- Upward Bound students are more than twice as likely to earn a bachelor's degree by age 24 than students in the lowest income quartile.
- Talent Search students are 33% more likely to enroll in college than other students from the bottom income quartile.

#### **Investing in Rural Communities**

TRIO programs are funded based on demonstrated need of the target area and schools they serve. Many serve rural communities, providing supplemental resources and opportunity that otherwise are not available.

#### College as Choice

TRIO programs have a rigorous recruitment and selection process. With over 3,400 project sites, TRIO offers a range of support services which allow low-income, first-generation students to apply for and be selected to receive help in pursuing their college dreams.

#### **High Yield on Investment**

TRIO's Student Support Services yields a return on investment of \$13 for every \$1 spend by the federal government with a 45.6% of participants earning an associate's degree or transferring to a four-year institute (vs 31.4% of eligible nonparticipants) and 51% of participants with a bachelor's degree (vs 43.4% of eligible nonparticipants).

## TRIO Advisors Attend Council for Opportunity in Education's Annual Policy Seminar in Washington, D.C.

Several MSUB TRIO staff members joined over a thousand attendees at the Council for Opportunity in Education 's (COE) Annual Seminar this March 2025.

During our week in D.C., we worked to keep TRIO programs effective, efficient, and funded. The seminar included a day of lobbying on Capitol Hill to get Congress members and Senators to sign the TRIO annual funding letter for FY26 in addition to advocating for FAFSA and grant issues TRIO programs are facing. Our team of TRIO advisors met with the offices of several Montanan Senators and Congressmen. The majority of these offices agreed to continue their support of TRIO programs and make TRIO programs a top priority. This support helps TRIO programs continue to ensure today's low-income, first-generation students and students with disabilities will have access to higher education.
